No. 3009/Agri.II(1)-2016/ 10854 The Governor of Haryana is pleased to notify the areas, crops, indemnity level, sum insured, premium rates and seasonality discipline etc. for the implementation of Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) in the State during Kharif 2016 & Rabi 2016-17, as per Administrative Approval of Govt. of India, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Department of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmers Welfare vide their reference No. 13015/03/2016-Credit II, dated 23.02.2016, as under:-

1. CROPS TO BE COVERED (Notified Crops)

Cotton, Paddy, Bajra and Maize crops will be covered during Kharif 2016 & Wheat, Barley, Mustard and Gram crops during Rabi 2016-17.

2. INSURANCE UNIT (IU)

The PMFBY will operate on the principle of "Area Approach" in the Insurance Unit (IU). The IU will be the revenue estate (village).

3. AREA TO BE COVERED

The PMFBY will be implemented in the entire State on cluster approach. Districts in clusters are as under:-

4. Coverage of Risks and Exclusions

The following stages of the crop and risks leading to crop loss will be covered under the scheme.

- a) Prevented Sowing/Planting Risk: Coverage of risk in case the insured area is prevented from sowing/planting due to deficit rainfall or adverse seasonal conditions.
- b) Standing Crop (Sowing to harvesting): Comprehensive risk insurance will be provided to cover yield losses due to non-preventable risks, viz. Drought, Dry spells, Flood, Inundation, Pests and Diseases, Landslides, Natural Fire and Lightning, Storm, Hailstorm, Cyclone, Typhoon, Tempest, Hurricane and Tornado.

- c) Post-Harvest Losses: Coverage will be available only up to a maximum period of two weeks from harvesting for those crops which are allowed to dry in cut and spread condition in the field after harvesting against specific perils of cyclone, cyclonic rains and unseasonal rains.
- d) Localized Calamities: Loss/damage resulting from occurrence of identified localized risks of hailstorm, landslide, and inundation affecting isolated farms will be covered.
- General Exclusions: Losses arising out of war and nuclear risks, malicious damage and other preventable risks will be excluded.

5. IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES

6. FARMERS TO BE COVERED

- a) All farmers including share-croppers and tenant farmers growing the notified crops in the IU will be eligible for coverage under the scheme.
- b) All farmers availing Seasonal Agricultural Operations (SAO) loans from Financial Institutions (i.e. loanee farmers) for the notified crops would be covered compulsorily.
- c) The scheme will be optional for the non-loanee farmers.

7. INDEMNITY LEVEL

The indemnity level will be 90% in case of all the notified crops.

8. THRESHOLD YIELD

The block wise Threshold Yield is given in Annexure-A . In case of blocks in respect of which historical data is not available the average Threshold Yield of the State will be taken as the Threshold Yield for calculating the claims.

9. SUM INSURED, PREMIUM RATES AND PREMIUM SUBSIDY

The sum insured, premium rate and premium subsidy are given in Annexure -B.

10. SEASONALITY DISCIPLINE

The seasonality discipline is as under:-

11. COLLECTION OF PROPOSALS AND PREMIUM FROM FARMERS

- a) The proposals from farmers will be collected/obtained by the banks as per para (X) of the Operational Guidelines (OGs) of PMFBY issued by Government of India, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare.
- b) The banks/branches will submit the consolidated proposals to the implementing agencies well within the stipulated cut-off dates and also upload the soft copy of insured details in crop insurance portal. The declarations/proposals format shall contain the details as per the format provided in the crop insurance portal. The said details are given in Annexure-C.
- c) The banks will also submit a weekly progress report of the number of farmers insured, area covered and premium collected to the Director Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Haryana & the concerned implementing agencies.
- d) In case of non-loanee farmers, the implementing agency will be responsible to verify the insurable interest of the applicant farmer and collect the land records, particulars of acreage, crops sown and contract/agreement details in case of share/tenant farmers etc.
- e) For any reason if a farmer changes the crop planned earlier, he should intimate the change to insurance company, at least 30 days before the cut-off date for buying insurance, through the bank/insurance company/insurance intermediary.

12. ASSESSMENT OF LOSS/SHORTFALL IN YIELD

The procedure mentioned in the OGs will be followed for assessment of loss/shortfall in yield.

a) Prevented Sowing/Planting Risk

- i) The cut-off dates for the purpose of 'prevented sowing/planting' payout will be 31st August in case of Kharif crops and 15th January in case of Rabi crops.
- ii) The State Government will declare an IU as having suffered prevented sowing/planting conditions with approximate areas in percentage of the unit. A Committee under the chairmanship of SDO (Civil) with Deputy Director Agriculture and Tehsildar concerned as members will submit a report about this to the Director of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Haryana through the Deputy Commissioner by 31st August in case of Kharif crops and by 15th January in case of Rabi crops.
- iii) For prevented sowing/planting, the data recorded at the nearest available Rain Gauge Station (RGS) will be considered wherever required. The details of Rain Gauge Stations are in Annexure-D. In case the nearest RGS is not functional for any reason, the second nearest RGS and so on, will be the reference Rain Gauge Station.

b) Standing Crop (Wide Spread Calamities)

- i) Shortfall in yield will be calculated by comparing the Threshold Yield with the Actual Yield estimated through Crop Cutting Experiments (CCEs). The CCEs will be undertaken for different crops on a scale decided by the State Government keeping in view the acreage covered in the scheme in different IUs/Blocks/districts/State.
- ii) In cases where require number of CCEs could not be conducted due to non-availability of adequate cropped area, the yield estimate for such IUs will be made by adopting the yield of next higher unit i.e. block. If the area in the block is also inadequate, the yield of the district will be adopted. If the area in the district is also inadequate, the yield of the nearest district will be adopted.
- iii) In case of 'On Account Payment of claims due to Mid-Season Adversity', the State Government will issue damage notification keeping in view the likely loss caused to the crops, rainfall data, crop condition reports by field officials, media reports etc.
- iv) A Committee under the chairmanship of SDO (Civil) with Deputy Director Agriculture, Tehsildar concerned and a representative of the Insurance Company as members will submit a report about the eligibility for 'On Account Payment' to the Director of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Haryana through the Deputy Commissioner, as and when such adversity occurs.
- v) 'On Account Payment' of claims will not be admissible if the adversity occurs within 15 days before the normal harvest time.

c) Post Harvest Losses

- i) The assessment of yield loss will be on individual plot basis in case of occurrence of cyclone, cyclonic rains and unseasonal rains resulting in damage to harvested crop lying in the field in 'cut and spread' condition, up to a maximum period of 14 days from harvesting.
- ii) The Implementing Agency will appoint Loss Assessors in sufficient number having the qualifications provided in OGs, for assessment of losses due to the operations of post harvest losses.
- iii) The loss will be jointly assessed by a team comprising of the Block Agriculture Officer, Loss Assessors and the concerned farmer.

d) Localized Risks

- i) The assessment of yield loss will be on individual plot basis in case of occurrence of localized perils/calamities viz Landslide, Hailstorm and Inundation affecting part of the IU or a plot.
 - ii) The Implementing Agency will appoint Loss Assessors in sufficient number having the qualifications provided in OGs, for assessment of losses due to the operations of localized risks.
 - iii) The loss will be jointly assessed by a team comprising of the Block Agriculture Officer, Loss Assessors and the concerned farmer.
 - iv) If the affected area under a notified crop is more than 25% of the total insured area in the IU, all the eligible farmers as per para (XV) (1)(A)(v) of the OG, would be eligible for financial support. Percentage of loss would be arrived at by requisite percentage of sample survey (as decided by the Committee of SDO (Civil), Deputy Director Agriculture, Tehsildar concerned and a representative of the Insurance Company) of affected area.
- e) In case the representative of the implementing agency, wherever part of a Committee, is not available/does not attend the meeting of the Committee or accompany during inspections, the other members of the committee will take appropriate decision in the light of the prevailing facts and circumstances, which will be final.

13. ACREAGE DISCREPANCY

The Insurance Company and Banks will ensure that no case of 'over insurance' takes place. Any discrepancy in this regard will be rectified by the insurance company with the help of land records, bank records, proposals/applications of farmers.

14. MONITORING OF THE SCHEME

- i) The insurance company will ensure that about 5% of the beneficiaries are verified by their Regional Offices /Local level Offices and report is sent to the District Level Monitoring Committee (DLMC).
- ii) The DLMC will cross verify at least 10% of the beneficiaries and send report to the Director, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Haryana.
- iii) 1 to 2 % of the beneficiaries will be verified by the Head Office of the Insurance Company and report sent to the Central Government.

15. OTHER CONDITIONS

- i) The implementing agency will open an office at all district head quarters with regular landline phone apart from mobile phone. At least one staff capable to handle the calls should be regularly available in the office. The details of the office, officials, telephone numbers etc. will be furnished to the Director, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and the Deputy Director of Agriculture concerned. The telephone numbers should be displayed for information of the general public at important places like D.C. Office, Tehsils, Banks, Mandies and other places visited by the farmers.
- ii) The implementing agency will open a State level office in Chandigarh/Panchkula and provide details to the Director, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare.
- iii) The banks will ensure that the all farmers availing crop loans/seasonal agricultural operations loans for the notified crops are insured.
- iv) The implementing agency will put in place all IT and other protocols provided in the OGs and as decided by the Government of India & State Government from time to time, for effective implementation of the scheme.

16. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF VARIOUS AGENCIES

The roles and responsibilities of various agencies i.e. Central Government, State Government, Insurance Companies, Financial Institutions/Banks, Insurance agents and Farmers will be as mentioned in the OGs.


